Decision and Reasons

The investigation revealed that the Complainant was involved in an altercation with her ex-husband while at her residence. The Complaint's actions were captured on video and the allegation made by her ex-husband was consistent with the footage. The Investigation determined there were sufficient reasonable grounds to believe an offence had been committed and the police were required to lay a charge in these circumstances.

Additionally, the Complaint was provided her rights to counsel and secondary caution. The investigation determined that although there was a delay in calling her lawyer while in custody, the delay was not unreasonable based on all the facts and the urgency to release the Complainant from custody.
