### De-identified Summary of Complaint

The complainant alleged that while attending a Pro-Palestinian rally they attempted to take a picture of a ceremony around the [REDACTED] and was unjustly targeted by police officers who demanded they return to the rally, as they might be offensive to others by carrying a Palestinian flag.

The complainant alleged discrimination against two (2) [REDACTED] police officers, and that their conduct undermined public trust. Furthermore, the complainant felt intimidated, harassed, and unjustly criminalized.
