De-identified Summary of Complaint

The Complainant reported two officers attended his residence in respect a dispute with his neighbours during which he had been threatened. He felt the officers did not take his complaint seriously and favoured his neighbours as he believed they were acquaintances through their employment. The Complainant chose not to participate in this investigative process.

Decision and Reasons**(1) Public-Undermine Public Trust-Sec10 CSP**

There was no evidence to support the neighbours and the Respondent Officers had a pre-existing relationship prior to the Complainants call for service to the police. Therefore a conflict of interest did not exist involving the Respondent Officers and the Complainants neighbours.

(2) Public-Duty-Neglect or Omit -Sec 19 CSPA Reg. 407/29

The Respondent Officers conducted a proper investigation, speaking to all parties involved and interviewing an independent witness. They concluded there was insufficient evidence to support the Complainant had been threatened by his neighbours and could not proceed further with any charges. The Investigator determined the Respondent Officer's did not conduct a neglectful investigation.
