De-identified Summary of Complaint		
The Complainant arrived home to find grass clippings and a discarded water bottle on her property. Subsequently, the Complainant blew the water bottle and grass clippings back onto the property adjacent to hers. The Complainant did so with a leaf blower and blew the debris on to the driveway of the neighbour's house.		
A resident intervened on behalf of the intended recipient, and confronted the Complainant about her conduct, and a dispute ensued.		
The matter escalated to the point where three separate 9-1-1 calls were generated and both involved parties alleged they were assaulted by the other.		
The Respondent Officers responded to the call for service and investigated the incident. At the conclusion of the investigation, no charges were laid against either party.		
On November 26, 2024, the Complainant filed a complaint against the investigating officers in relation to the findings of their investigation, inaccuracies found in the report, and the conduct of Respondent Officer #1 during the investigation.		
This complaint was referred for investigation on February 5, 2025.
