This investigation has revealed the officer(s) were in the lawful performance of their duties and acted in accordance with all governing authorities. RO3 and RO4 followed the proper guidelines within procedures and were professional during their interaction with the Complainant.

Based on the available information, the Investigator has concluded that there is insufficient evidence to establish reasonable grounds that misconduct has occurred.

Neglects to do Duty

This investigation has revealed the officer(s) were in the lawful performance of their duties and acted in accordance with all governing authorities. RO1 and RO2 conducted a thorough investigation and advised the Complainant of his rights while interviewing him about the allegations.
