De-identified Summary of Complaint

The complainant alleges on three separate occasions she has been stopped by police without lawful justification. The complaint submits officer(s) are engaging in a pattern of harassment and are being discriminatory in their actions. The complainant alleges one of the stops resulted in her unlawful detention and the unlawful search of her vehicle.

Unsubstantiated Code of Conduct Allegations

Decision and Reasons

In conclusion, there is insufficient evidence to reasonably conclude any of the officers involved in conducting traffic stops of the complainant acted in a discriminatory or harassing manner. All of the officers who spoke with the complainant were polite and professional and acted within the authorities provided to them by legislation.

This investigation found no evidence any of the officer's treated the complainant any different due to her race or any other reason as outlined by the prohibited grounds of discrimination.

A review of the officers who had searched the complainant's plate on CPIC had found all the searches were conducted during the course of their policing duties.
