Allegations that the officer was driving aggressively and tailgating, prior to a traffic stop of the Complainant.

Unsubstantiated Code of Conduct Allegations

10. (1) A police officer shall not conduct themselves in a manner that undermines, or is likely to undermine, public trust in policing.

Decision and Reasons

When critically comparing the Complainants observations and with the evidence gathered, the driving behaviour described is also in line with the explanation afforded by the respondent officer.

It is reasonable that the officer had to accelerate his vehicle to be able to catch up with the Complainants vehicle quickly.

Body Worn Camera evidence did not support the allegations.
