The complainant contends they were unlawfully arrested. The involved officers failed to conduct them selfs professionally.

Unsubstantiated Code of Conduct Allegations

Decision and Reasons

Officers did not have a breath test on scene at the time their suspicion formed and thus could not use one. One scene was an officer trained to do a roadside physical test for sobriety. That test was conducted and the complainant failed. London PSB had the traffic unit review the Axon BWC which showed the stop, search, detention, roadside sobriety test, and arrest. The officer's actions were determined to be authorized, as was the towing of the complainant's vehicle. Ultimately the complainant was released as there was no evidence of impairment to a criminal level. The process of towing a vehicle upon arrest results in scenarios where, after further investigation, the arrested party is released without charges - they are still subject to a release fee from the Towing Company.
