The Complainant alleged the Respondent Officer's failed to investigate allegations of dangerous and impaired driving.

Unsubstantiated Code of Conduct Allegations

Decision and Reasons

The Complainant reported that the Respondent Officers warned a group of youths with respect their actions however failed to address the youths concerns with respect to another party involved who they believed was impaired and drove dangerously.

The Investigator reviewed officers reports, notes, a witness statement, 911 and Dispatcher audio recordings, and Case Law (Korchinski v. Office of the Independent Police Review Director, 2022, and Hill v [REDACTED] Regional Police Services Board, 2007).

The investigator concluded that the Respondent Officer's responded to a complaint of mischief to a motor vehicle by a group of youths. The youths were subsequently chased by the driver of the motor vehicle. The owner of the motor vehicle as well as one of the youths contacted 911. All involved parties were spoken by the Respondent Officers. There was evidence of the mischief to the motor vehicle however the youths did not provide any evidence to the Respondent Officers with respect to impaired or dangerous driving. There was no evidence to support the Respondent Officers failed to conduct their duties as required under the Community Safety and Policing Act (CSPA).
